What is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)?

You might be surprised to discover how many common products found in your home or under the kitchen sink could be hazardous to your home or even the environment if used or disposed of improperly. Most homes contain three (3) to ten (10)gallons of these everyday products.



Unwanted household products, labeled as FLAMMABLE, TOXIC, CORRO-SIVE, REACTIVE, COMBUSTIBLE or EXPLOSIVE are common household hazardous wastes (HHW). You can tell if a product is hazardous if words such as, POISON, DANGER, WARNING and CAUTION appear on the label. The most common products include:
