



Town Of Longboat Key Recycling Program

Please place the following items in your single stream recycle cart:

Paper Items: Newspapers, Magazines, Catalogues, Junk Mail, Paper, Brown Paper Bags, Brown Wrapping Paper, Envelopes, Phone Books.

Metal Items: Aluminum and Tin/Steel Beverage and Food Cans. Steel Jar Lids

Glass: Glass (all colors) Containers for Drinks and Food.

Plastic Items: Plastic Bottles used for Juice, Water, Drinks, Spices, Soap / Detergent. Look for the recycle triangle with numbers 1 – 7.

All in one cart, no sorting!

Remember: Don't place recyclables in bags or line your cart with plastic bags because plastic bags are not accepted. Your plastic bags can be recycled at your grocery store. Corrugated cardboard should be flattened and placed at the curb to be collected along with your household garbage.

The pick-up day for residential recycling is **Monday**. Please place your **cart** curbside, three feet from other containers and five feet from the street, before 7:00 AM.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)
