**SUBJECT:** Resolution 2014-06, Budget Transfer in the Amount of \$200,000 from General Fund, Commission Contingency, for Planning Services Related to Town Center and Consulting Services to Amend the Town's Zoning Code

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In anticipation of the first steps in the implementation process following the ULI presentation, the Planning & Zoning Department is requesting an increase in their Professional Services account in the amount of \$25,000 for contracted consulting services to continue their work on a future Town Center.

In addition, \$41,000 is requested for other contracted consulting services for a planning assistant from University of Florida and \$134,000 for short-term and long-term changes to the Town's Land Development Code. Funds needed include, but are not limited to, outside consulting services and internal costs related to public workshops, public hearings, and legal notifications and advertisements.

I would estimate year two to be in the \$75-\$100,000 range for the LDC/Comp Plan changes, with less in year three, \$50,000. Even without the ULI study, we were aware that there were serious issues that needed to be addressed in our LDC, which would have needed significant funding.

This action does not increase the Town's general fund budget and a \$12,000 balance will remain in the General Fund Commission Contingency account as follows:

**RESOLUTION 2014-06**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF LONGBOAT KEY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2013-2014 BUDGET BY TRANSFERRING BUDGETED BUT UNALLOCATED FUNDS FROM COMMISSION CONTINGENCY IN GENERAL SERVICES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$200,000.00 TO THE PLANNING AND ZONING PROFESSIONAL SERVICES OTHER ACCOUNT IN THE AMOUNT \$175,000 FOR VARIOUS ACTIVITIES RELATED TO THE ZONING CODE UPDATE AND \$25,000 TO PROFESSIONAL SERVICES – TOWN CENTER FOR PLANNING SERVICES; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Longboat Key has budgeted, in the Commission Contingency Account in General Services, unallocated funds to be used at the Town Commission’s discretion to provide for unexpected costs and projects in the Town of Longboat Key; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Town has contracted with various outside consultants to provide consulting services for Town planning and Zoning Code changes; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Town’s Planning and Zoning Department currently has \$90,100.00 budgeted in professional services earmarked for other commitments; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Planning and Zoning professional services account will need to be increased before any other planned projects can occur; and,

**WHEREAS**, there are available and unallocated funds in the fiscal year 2013-2014 budget in the Commission Contingency account; and,

**WHEREAS**, a budget transfer of available funds must occur in the fiscal year 2013-2014 budget; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Longboat Key, Town Charter, Article V, Section 9(d) provides for such action.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, be it resolved by the Town Commission of the Town of Longboat Key, Florida, that:

SECTION 1. The above Whereas clauses are true and correct and are hereby ratified and confirmed.

SECTION 2. The Town Commission hereby transfers, in the fiscal year 2013-2014 budget, Two Hundred Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$200,000.00) from account 001.3000.519.9901 Contingency in the General Services account, to the following accounts:

001.2500.515.3113 Professional Services-Town Center	\$ 25,000

SECTION 3. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
