Call to Order

1. Pending Litigation/Administrative Proceeding:

Pursuant to Gubernatorial Executive Orders 20-179 and 20-193, notice is hereby given that the Town of Longboat Key has called a Virtual Special Meeting of the Town Commission at the request of its legal counsel to be held on September 30, 2020, at 1 p.m. for the Town Commission to provide advice and direction relating to a proposed consent order in the administrative matter of *Florida Department of Environmental Protection v. Town of Longboat Key,* OGC File No. 20-1261. The Town Commission will convene in a public virtual Special Meeting before recessing into a separate virtual Attorney-Client Session.

A. PUBLIC VIRTUAL SPECIAL MEETING

The Town encourages public participation in its public virtual meetings. To participate in the public portion of the Special Virtual Meeting on September 30, 2020, which begins at 1 p.m. the public has the following options:
