2. Update on The Bay Park Conservancy Master Plan

Mr. A.G. Laffley, representing the Sarasota Bayfront Planning Organization will present an overview of The Bay Park Conservancy Master Plan, including Phase 1 of the Bay Park

3. Sarasota Downtown Transportation Projects and US 41 and Gulfstream Stormwater Project

City staff will provide an overview of current and planned transportation projects within the downtown area of Sarasota, including water taxi, Sarasota in Motion, regional transit ideas, bike share, parking and other transportation related solutions in St. Armands. This item includes an update on efforts to alleviate the periodic flooding at the US 41 and Gulfstream intersection.

4. Barrier Island Traffic Study Update

Town staff will present an update on the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Barrier Island Transportation Study (BITS) findings and recommendations to improve traffic flow and safety along barrier island routes. The study has completed Phases 1 and 2, and is in the early stage of Phase 3.

5. Public Transit

The Town of Longboat Key is currently served by SCAT Route 18, which terminates at Bay Isles Parkway, (Publix shelter) and MCAT with a reservation-based, on demand curb-to-curb service. The Town's vision is for development of a single, unified consistent transit solution promoting in-season ridership.
