2. Impasse Resolution Hearing Between the Town of Longboat Key and the Southwest Florida Police Benevolent Association, Inc. (SWFPBA)

Pursuant to Florida Statutes Section 447.403, Resolution of Impasses, the Town Commission will hold a public hearing to consider two issues that were not included in a tentative agreement between the Town of Longboat Key and the SWFPBA. The Town's Management Team and representatives of the PBA have negotiated a number of months over a Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) to replace the CBA which expired on September 30, 2019. In accordance with the Public Employee Relations Commission (PERC) rules and Florida Statutes, Chapter 447, Labor Organizations, an impasse was declared in the negotiations with respect to the issues of retirement and wages. The SWFPBA elected to request a public hearing directly before the Town Commission and bypass the appointment of a Special Magistrate by the State of Florida. Recommended action: Provide direction to Manager.
